Students will be required to **read at least one (1) new novel** (definition: a long-printed story about imaginary characters and events) over the July/August holidays and upon completion, **answer the questions below as a review**. It is expected that answers should be presented in **paragraph form**. A novel review is not a summary of the contents of a book. A good novel review is a commentary on the book. That means that it analyses, evaluates, and judges the contents of the novel. Upon resumption in September 2021, they will be offered the opportunity to **present this at the assemblies**. Also, to return with at **least <u>two (2) novels</u>** to be used in **reading during DEAR**.
