- 1. **JHC Work Experience programme:** This initiative was praised, and the process for placing students was confirmed. Due diligence will be followed.
- 2. **Classroom arrangement:** This is to confirm that Year 7s will be in homerooms, and other students will be migrating.
- 3. **Guidance & Counselling:** A question was raised about a dedicated Guidance Counsellor, and it was confirmed that we have three qualified staff currently engaged in fulfilling this role.
- 4. **Preparing students for SAT exams:** JHC has no special classes, but our dual curriculum is enough to prepare students for this, as evidenced by the performances of past students who consistently attempted and received superb results in the SATs.
- 5. **JHC Entrance Examination:** The online application system has been tweaked to provide confirmation via email instead of just a message flashing up on the screen.
- 6. **Academic calendar synchronisation:** JHC is guided by the Lagos State government calendar and the requirements of the British curriculum, and every attempt is made to synchronise our calendar to satisfy both authorities.
- 7. **Creating an account for minor medical expenses:** The current system will remain, and we can review it later if necessary.
- 8. **Subject selection in alignment with future studies and work:** JHC is currently doing this, with Year 9 being pivotal. These students and parents are exposed to the Careers and University Fairs to assist with decision-making regarding university studies and career selection. However, we are always looking for ways to improve, as nothing is set in stone.
- 9. Call time for students in residence: This will be expanded; however, parents are reminded that if there are exceptional circumstances, they could reach out to the houseparent to call at a suitable time. Please note that the emphasis is on exceptional circumstances.
- 10. Accessing student results online: Parents are reminded to flag any issues to the IT unit immediately. Also, JHC will be running an improved system from term two onward.
